

HEAVENLY HIDES

A guide to shopping for today's most luxurious leather furnishings

Leather is one of the few home furnishings that looks better the more it's used. Quality leather furniture actually improves with age. It's an investment that can last for many years.

A starting point when shopping for leather furnishings is knowing the language. Here are some of the terms you're likely to come across:

FULL GRAIN

From the top layer of the hide, full grain leather retains its natural grain and is the best you can buy.

TOP GRAIN

With imperfections sanded away to give it a more uniform look, top grain is a quality grade of leather.

SPLIT GRAIN

A durable, but not as supple, leather that comes from the layers beneath the top grain.

ANILINE

Aniline leather is supple from being soaked in aniline dye, but offers less stain protection than other types of leather.

SEMI-ANILINE

Semi-aniline leather has better stain protection, thanks to being treated with a small amount of pigment.

PIGMENTED

Because it's finished with a pigmented coating, pigmented leather has more stain and scuff-resistance, making it one of the most popular leathers in home furnishings.

BONDED LEATHER

With the look and feel of all-leather, bonded leather is a blend of polyester/cotton, polyurethane, and leather bonded to the back of fabric. It's soft and durable, and is an affordable alternative. ☞

Grain of Truth

Tips for choosing the best leather furnishings for your home and lifestyle

Be hands-on. Take your time when shopping. Wear something comfortable, and don't be afraid to sit down, stretch out, or recline, just as you would at home. Feel all the surfaces of the piece you're considering—not just the armrest or seat.

Know the language. Know what type of leather is best for you and your lifestyle by learning the terminology associated with different grades of leather.

Consider your lifestyle. If you have young children and/or pets, you may want to consider leathers that offer more protection from stains (such as pigmented). If you're going for pure comfort and aren't worried about stains, pure aniline leather has maximum suppleness.

Look beyond the living room. Leather is a favorite for recliners and sofas, but don't overlook other furnishings: benches, ottomans, bar stools, and dining chairs. Leather-covered headboards, cabinets and other accent pieces can also add a look of luxury—and durability—to your home.

Go for color. For many years, brown has been the color of choice for leather furniture. Today, however, there's a wide variety of colors available for everyone, from deep red to aqua to white to metallic gray. ☙

MAKE AN ENTRANCE

Expert ideas for improving your home's foyer or entryway

What are your first thoughts when you enter someone's home? Do you feel warm and welcomed? Or does the entryway seem cold and impersonal?

- **Floor decor.** Be practical when choosing your entryway flooring. Choose something that matches not only your style, but your lifestyle. Stone floors may be too hard if you have small children, and carpet may not work well if you have pets. ☙





- Make your entrance stand out by painting the door a welcoming color such as crimson red, cobalt blue, slate gray, or kelly green.
- A welcome mat does just that—welcomes your guests, and keeps debris from the foyer. Choose one that's nicely sized and lays securely in front of your door to avoid falls.
- Ensure your guests find your home easily by keeping your house or street numbers large enough to see and stylish enough to be noticed, yet easily read.





Gone are the days when televisions—in chunky wood-cabinet form—were a piece of furniture unto themselves. Today's slim and sleek TVs (and other media components) deserve to be displayed properly, not only for aesthetics, but for optimal viewing.

Here are a few ideas to help you create a space that's stylish and inviting:

- Choose a piece that keeps your cords hidden and out of the way. Cord management is a primary feature of many of today's media furnishings.

- Don't forget storage options. If you have a lot of games, DVDs, or audio/visual accessories, pieces with solid doors will keep them hidden from view. For more decorative displays, choose open storage or glass doors.
- Make sure your TV console is proportional to the size of your TV—if it looks too big for the piece, it most likely is.
- Consider the size of your room. Larger spaces are great for a wall unit or a console flanked by bookcases or piers; a corner unit works well in a small space.
- Remember that bedroom TV consoles are usually higher, to make viewing while in bed easier. For living spaces, 30" is the perfect height for TV viewing.
- Go for a mix-and-match look with your space—your media console doesn't have to exactly match your existing pieces. Let the finish or a design element coordinate the pieces.
- Most importantly—don't settle. Find an entertainment center or media console you'll love as much as your television and other home furnishings. ☞

5 Simple tips for creating the ultimate dining space for eating in and entertaining

Has your dining room become an all-but-forgotten space, used only a couple times a year for holidays or special occasions? Here are some ways to put the “divine” back into dining, and make your dining room a place to be savored.

Top tips for divine dining spaces

Make sure your table allows at least 36" from the wall or other furnishings so that your guests can move comfortably.

When planning for chairs, allow at least 24" of space per person around the table. A 6-foot table will typically seat three people comfortably on each side.

To ensure chair legs stay on it, choose a rug that's at least 24" larger than your table on every side.

The bottom of your chandelier or light fixture should be about 30-36" above the top of the table.

Easy ways to improve your sleep—and your health



Not getting enough sleep can be a nightmare. It can affect everything you do, from your productivity to your health. Getting the right amount of rest helps you feel ready to tackle the day and may boost everything from your mood to your metabolism.

SLEEP SCENARIOS

Getting a good night's sleep begins before bedtime. Limit alcohol, caffeine, and exercise in the hours before going to bed. Create a regular sleep routine by going to bed at the same time every day, seven days a week.

The light emitted by electronics such as televisions, tablets, and smartphones can also trick your brain into thinking it's time to be awake, so avoid them before bedtime. Keep your

bedroom dark, quiet, and cool—experts say a temperature between 60 and 67 degrees Fahrenheit is ideal.

MATTRESS MATTERS

It's difficult to get a good night's rest if your mattress is past its prime. If your sleep set is around eight years old, or you wake up with aches, pains or just don't feel refreshed, it's probably time for a replacement mattress set.

When shopping for a new mattress, dress in comfortable clothing and spend at least 15 minutes rest-testing each bed. Shop at a store you trust, and ask questions of the sales associate. Don't rush—a sleep set is an important investment, so give it careful consideration. Bring your partner with you to find the best match for you both. ☞

INNERSPRING

Steel coil support systems

HYBRID




YELLOW
